- Senate Bill 14: Senate Bill 14 was passed by the Legislature, signed by Gov. Kelly and took effect on January 25, 2021. It extends the state of disaster emergency through March 31, 2021. Here is a link to SB 14 on our website:
- Executive Order No. 21-06: Executive Order No. 21-06 was signed by Governor Kelly on 2-23-2021. It covers temporary authorization for additional vaccinators during the state of disaster emergency. It states the following: the temporary grant of authority applies to any Kansas pharmacist, pharmacy student or intern, podiatrist, dentist, dential hygienist, physician's assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, nurse, advanced emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician, and paramedic or any of the above professional who are allowed to practice in the State during the public health emergency involving COVID-19 who may administer injections or inoculations within their scope of practice. This authority is limited to those professionals who have successfully completed: 1) a course of study and training in vaccination storage, protocols, injection technique, emergency procedures, and recordkeeping as part of their profession; and 2)have taken a course in cardiopulmonary (CPR) for humans and have a current certificate when administering the vaccine.
- The CDC has a course of study that meets the criteria listed above. Here is the link to the information: https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/ed/courses.html. This is the link to the page in which you need to register with the TCEO system to access the modules and take the post course test. A certificate will then be issued.
