Call to order: The APRN Committee meeting was called to order by Melissa

Oropeza, DNP, APRN-BC, CGRN, Chair at 2:20 p.m.

Review onsite packet: There was nothing for the onsite packet.

Add/Rev. Agenda: There were no additions/revisions to the agenda.

Announcements: M. Oropeza introduced Michaela Hysten as a new member of the

Board.

Minutes: The minutes of the June 28, 2022, APRN Committee meeting were

reviewed. It was moved to accept the June 28, 2022, APRN Committee minutes as written. Motion #1 Harrington/Gosnell

Adopted.

There were no minutes from the September 13, 2022, APRN Committee as a quorum of Committee members were not present

and the meeting could not be held.

Unfinished Business:

CNM-I Regulations: J. Harrington reported on the CNM-I Regulations. The Committee

met in October 2022 and the discussion was the CNM-I Regulations language. It was discovered that some of the language that went through legislative was not what the Committee had agreed upon or voted on. The Committee will now need to go back and do a whole language revision on these regulations. This language revision will impact the regulations that involved the Board of Nursing. The next

meeting will be held in January 2023.

PMP Committee Report:

S. Gregg reported on the PMP Committee Report. Shannon reported that KTRACS Committee met in November. There was continued discussion on funding for the KTRAC program. The Committee also discussed wanting to get the APRN Committee input on creating educational content for Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) that specifically relates to KTRACS that would be available on the KSBN website for Nurse Practitioners who are involved in the KTRACS program. Would that be a benefit to Nurse Practitioners?

There were technical issues when S. Greg was giving her report to the APRN Committee. After several attempts to rectify the issue the Committee decided to move on and to have S. Gregg give her comments at the March 2023 APRN Committee.

National Certification:

C. Moreland reported on the national certification approval requirements that involved the HB 2279 that will go into effect on July 1, 2023.

On or after July 1, 2023, anybody seeking initial application through Kansas shall have a current advanced practice registered nurse certification in such applicant's specific rule and population focus that has been granted by a national certifying organization recognized by the board and whose certification standards are approved by the board as equal to or greater than the corresponding standards established by the board; and an advanced practice register nurse whose initial license is prior to July 1, 2023, may submit evidence of certification upon renewal.

The Board of Nursing does not have any criteria to approve these certifications standards or agencies as this is a new requirement for the Board. The consensus of the APRN Committee is to have those APRN's who are renewing their license provide malpractice and certification at the time of their renewal and for initial applicants seeking licensure through Kansas to follow the APRN Consensus.

Implementation of HB 2279: C. Moreland reported on the implementation of HB 2279. The language in the bill for malpractice insurance for initial licensure has been interpreted by KSBN and the KSBN legal counsel to mean that anybody seeking initial license with Kansas must have malpractice insurance before they can be licensed in Kansas. This has caused an issue for some as some must have a job first before they can get malpractice insurance and must have a license before they can start working. For those who have this issue we can give

them a temporary permit to allow them to work and obtain their malpractice license once they have a temporary license.
