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RN and LPN SCOPE of PRACTICE: Components of Nursing Comparison Chart

By law, the scope of practice for the registered nurse (RN) and the licensed practical nurse (LPN) differs. The RN functions at an independent level while the LPN functions at a dependent level. This chart provides a general comparison only. Standards of care set minimum criteria for competency and may be defined by nursing associations, accrediting organizations, nurse practice acts, and facility policy and procedures.

Topics of Practice Calls:

ARPN: Telehealth (x7); independent practice (x3); DNR (x3); starting a business (x4); medical spas (x6); question about a new license; ages to see with adult certification (x2); procedures (i.e., colonoscopies); reporting an RN working without a license; prescriptive authority; psych nurse gave a two-week notice, but facility cancelled all of her appointments; worries about a complaint; dispensing medication; reporting an individual giving Botox; death certificates; pharmacies; writing prescriptions for restraints; patient abandonment; administration of Ketamine; working as a medical records person; midwives treating men; completing a lumbar puncture; ages to see as a pediatric APRN; refusing care to a patient; collaborative agreements; full practice authority; LLCs; prescriptive authority; malpractice insurance; midwives in a critical access hospital; epidermal injections.

CRNA: Doing a school physical.

RN: Critical access hospital protocols; medical spas (x3), IV mobile hydration, starting IV hydration therapy and wellness clinic (x3), providing IV therapy; mandated reporting; scope of practice (x5), scope of practice for LPNs; patient abandonment; facility oversight; body sculpting business; who can sign DNR; starting a Reiki business; starting a business; RNs working as an LPN or CMA; RN on abuse registry; liability insurance; how to sign name; drug impairment; questions about license (x2); health coaching; CNEs; determination of death; working at a boy scout camp; performing C-arm radiology; licensing requirements.

School Nurses: Applying sun protection; delegation; supervising agency LPNs; requirements for school nurses; suctioning.

LPN: IV protocols; IV hydration (x2), IV therapy (x3); supervising RNs (x3), supervision of LPNs; scope of practice (x6), scope of practice as a DON; wound care; signing death certificates; refresher courses; application questions.

Other: Scope of practice (x2); collaborative agreements; nurse with ULP, reporting ULP, other ULP questions (x2); medical spas; home health IV therapy; who can pronounce death; going to nursing school with a felony; DNR (x3), professional organization; complaints; scope of practice for APRNs, LPNs (x3); telehealth (x2); NP with mental health certification doing assessments; reporting complaints (x3); LPNs drawing blood; who can take verbal orders at hospice; virtual doula services; is posting on TikTok ethical; clarification of a license; getting a license with a misdemeanor; nursing school; nursing in other states.
