KSBN FY 24 & 25 Budget

- Budget hearing for House was held Monday, Jan 22 in the Social Service Budget Committee. That committee approved our budget and presented it to the House Appropriations on January 24. They voted to approve it. That should be it for the House.
- Budget hearing for the Senate was held Monday, January 29 in the Transparency and Ethics Committee. The committee approved our budget and presented it to the Senate Ways and Means Committee on Feb. 6 at 10:30 am. They voted to approve it. That should be it for the Senate.

- Friday, April 5th (First Adjournment): No bills considered after this date except Bills vetoed by Governor, Omnibus Appropriations Act and Omnibus Reconciliations Spending Limit Bill
- Veto Session is anticipated to begin on April 29th. The House Appropriations and Senate Ways and Means committees will meet April 25 & 26th.
