**Kansas State Board of Nursing Announces  
Retirement of Executive Administrator Carol Moreland, MSN, RN, CPM**

Topeka, Kansas — March 25, 2026 — The Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) announces the retirement of Carol Moreland, MSN, RN, CPM, effective April 10, 2026, who has served the agency with unwavering dedication for 15 years, including the past 9 years as Executive Administrator.

Carol began her tenure with KSBN as an Education Specialist, where she quickly demonstrated her commitment to nursing regulation and public protection. Her leadership, vision, and steady guidance led to her appointment as Executive Administrator, a role in which she has successfully navigated some of the most significant and complex periods in the agency's history.

During her time as Executive Administrator, Carol played a key role in advancing major legislative and regulatory milestones, including the passage of APRN Full Practice Authority in Kansas and the adoption and implementation of the Nurse Licensure Compact, both of which have expanded access to care and strengthened the nursing workforce across the state.

Carol also led the agency through the unprecedented challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, ensuring that regulatory processes remained responsive, flexible, and focused on protecting the public while supporting Kansas nurses during a time of extraordinary need.

Beyond her work in Kansas, Carol has contributed to the national advancement of nursing regulation through her service on the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Awards Committee. Under her leadership, the Kansas State Board of Nursing was honored with the NCSBN Regulatory Achievement Award, recognizing the Board's significant contributions to promoting public policy that ensures the safe and effective practice of nursing in the interest of public welfare.

The Kansas State Board of Nursing extends its sincere gratitude to Carol Moreland for her years of dedicated service and her steadfast commitment to public protection.
