### HB 2528 Implementation Update

Topeka, Kansas — April 29, 2026 — The Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) is actively working to implement the requirements of HB 2528. As part of this process, we are updating our licensing, verification (Nursys e-Notify), and related computer systems to reflect the changes in the law.

At this time, certain system features, including the display of the 30-day late-renewal period, have not yet been fully configured. Even though the system is not fully reconfigured, licensees will be provided with the full benefit of the 30-day late-renewal period set forth in HB 2528.

For example, if your license was set to expire on April 30, 2026, and your status currently shows as “lapsed,” your license may still be active during the applicable 30-day late-renewal period.

This bill became law in Kansas on April 16, 2026, when it was published in the Kansas Register. We encourage all applicants, licensees, and other interested individuals to review the official version of HB 2528 published in the Kansas Register for the most current statutory language.
