Strengthening Nurse License Monitoring Through Nursys e-Notify

July 28, 2026 – Topeka, Kansas -- The Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) is playing an important role in supporting a safe, competent and compliant nursing workforce. KSBN is joining with the Kansas Hospital Association (KHA), and the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) in Kansas' first ever Nursys e-Notify statewide awareness campaign.

We are pleased to join in their efforts to educate and inform nurses across Kansas of Nursys e-Notify, a free, secure service that provides notifications of changes to nurse licensure and disciplinary status.

During August and September Kansas nurses who have not self-enrolled in Nursys e-Notify will be receiving email invitations to complete a streamlined self-enrollment process. KSBN and KHA are encouraging all nurses in Kansas to enroll in Nursys e-Notify. As the only national nurse licensure and disciplinary database, Nursys e-Notify supports compliance, workforce management and patient safety.

Nurses enrolling in e-Notify can easily verify and monitor their licensure status and expiration updates, license verifications for endorsement, and discipline notifications, and can create and manage multiple license renewal reminders. They are also alerted to any new licenses issued in their name.
