**SUMMARY ORDER**

The above matter comes before the Kansas State Board of Nursing (Board) pursuant to authority granted to the Board by K.S.A. 65-1120. The Board hereby proposes to find facts and take disciplinary action against Angela Banks, (Licensee) by way of Summary Order as provided by K.S.A. 77-537.

1. a. Licensee is licensed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas. The Board has jurisdiction over the Licensee and the subject matter of this action.

b. Licensee's address per her reinstatement application is 2609 Nottingham Dr. Bellevue NE 68123.

2. The role of the Kansas State Board of Nursing is to protect citizens of Kansas.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1120(a), the Kansas State Board of Nursing may deny, revoke, limit or suspend any license, certificate of qualification or authorization to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse, as a licensed practical nurse, as an advanced registered nurse practitioner or as a registered nurse anesthetist that is issued by the board or applied for under this act or may publicly or privately censure a licensee or holder of a certificate of qualification or authorization, if the applicant, licensee or holder of a certificate of qualification or authorization is found to have violated the Nurse Practice Act. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-1110 the Kansas State Board of Nursing may also assess a civil fine not to exceed \$1,000.00 for the first violation of a law or rule and regulation applicable to the practice for which such person has been granted a license.

4. After an investigation, the Board's investigative committee found reasonable grounds to believe that the licensee violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-1120, and referred this matter for further proceedings.

5. K.S.A. 77-511(a)(2)(A) of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act authorizes the use of summary proceedings by a state agency if the use of summary proceedings does not violate any provision of law, the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and an opportunity to participate to persons other than the parties, and the state agency believes in good faith, after investigation of the facts, that the allegations will be supported to the applicable standard of proof.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

6. (a) On or about September 6, 2013 the licensee, while employed as a travel nurse for Medical Solutions in Omaha, Nebraska, and contracted to work as a registered nurse at St. Francis Hospital in Tulsa, Oklahoma, falsified her timesheet by copying and pasting the unit manager's signature onto payroll documentation for two (2) 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. shifts which the licensee had completed on September 3 and September 4, 2013.

(b) Licensee was disciplined by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing for the malfeasance stated in paragraph (a) above.

(c) Licensee was disciplined by the California Board of Registered Nursing for the malfeasance stated in paragraph (a) above.

(d) Licensee allowed her Kansas license to lapse on July 31, 2015.

(e) Licensee filed applications for reinstatement on June 6, 2016 and July 10, 2016; these application processes were abandoned.

(f) Licensee filed for reinstatement again on February 13, 2017.

#### VIOLATIONS

7. The above fact findings establish evidence that the Licensee violated the following provisions of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act:

Count 1: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(1), to be guilty of fraud or deceit in practicing nursing or in procuring or attempting to procure a license to practice nursing.

Count 2: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(8), to have a license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or as a practical nurse denied, revoked, limited or suspended, or to be publicly or privately censured, by a licensing authority of another state, agency of the United States government, territory of the United States or country or to have other disciplinary action taken against the applicant or licensee by a licensing authority of another state, agency of the United States government, territory of the United States or country.

Count 3: K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6) and K.A.R. 60-3-110, to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board; to wit: inaccurately recording, falsifying, or altering any record of a patient or agency or of the board.

#### DISPOSITION

8. Licensee is in need of education. Licensee's application will not be granted unless she, within sixty (60) days of this order, completes and provides documentation to the Legal Department, Kansas State Board of Nursing, of the two hour *The Nurse Practice Act: An Overview for Nurses* home study CNE available through the Via Christi Regional Medical Center: <https://www.viachristi.org/health-professionals/nursingallied-health/cne-wichita>

These hours WILL NOT apply to the 30 CNE hours required for the next registration period.

It is licensee's burden if and when this CNE is completed to alert the Legal Department.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF NURSING THAT

1. Licensee is publicly reprimanded.
2. Licensee's application is held in abeyance pending timely completion of the required CNE.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537, this decision, which is called a Summary Order, is subject to your request for a hearing. If you desire a hearing, you must submit or direct a written request for hearing to: Kansas State Board of Nursing, Legal Division, 900 SW Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230, (785) 296-4325. THIS REQUEST MUST BE SUBMITTED WITHIN FIFTEEN (15) DAYS FROM THE DATE OF THIS ORDER. If a hearing is not requested in the time and manner stated, this Summary Order becomes effective as a final order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the time for requesting a hearing. If a hearing is requested, the prior issuance of a summary order shall not affect the burden of proof. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-531, if the Summary Order is served by mail, three days are added to the time limits set out above.




**FINAL ORDER NOTICE OF RIGHTS**
